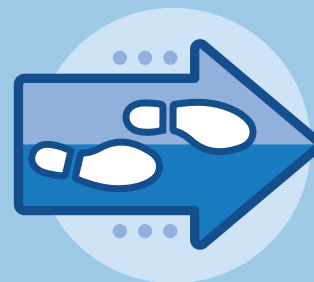
5 Make the most of work experience.
