Resource description	This is a set of activities designed to promote a career development culture in primary schools using a whole-school approach. The activities are organised into four sections. The first is about self-awareness and self-conceptualisation and contains six groups of activities. The second is about acting sensibly and contains three activities. The third is about empathy and handling relationships and contains five activities. The fourth is about building skills and contains four groups of activities. The program for primary schools is part of the special-purpose tools component of the Australian Blueprint for Career Development . The Blueprint is a framework that 'identifies the skills, attitudes and knowledge' that will foster the making of sound choices and the ability to 'effectively manage' careers.					
Relevance of resource to careers education	The activities in the program are well designed and appropriate for an audience of upper-primary students. Each activity includes a lesson plan (sometimes two) describing the background, learning experiences and the resources needed. Sometimes the activity also includes an extended introductory discussion and makes a connection to particular competencies in the Australian Blueprint for Career Development.
